the social and cultural changes of the last century have transformed death from an everyday fact to something hidden from view shifting between the practical and the theoretical the professional and the intimate the real and the fictitious this collection of essays explores the continued power of death over our lives it examines the idea and experience of death from an interdisciplinary perspective including studies of changing burial customs throughout europe an account of a dying party in the netherlands examinations of the fascination with violent death in crime fiction and the phenomenon of serial killer art analyses of death and bereavement in poetry fiction and autobiography and a look at audience reactions to depictions of death on screen by studying and considering how death is thought about in the contemporary era we might restore the natural place it has in our lives

john lurz offers an examination of the ways major modernist novels use the physical book to track the passing of time in which reading necessarily unfolds his study explores the sense of finitude and transience that the works of marcel proust james joyce and virginia woolf share with and transmit to their readers

the inescapable reality of death has given rise to much of literature s most profound and moving work d j enright s wonderfully eclectic selection presents the words of poet and novelist scientist and philosopher mystic and sceptic

and alongside these professional writers he allows the voices of ordinary people to be heard for this is a subject on which there are no real experts and wisdom lies in many unexpected places

a moving reflection on a subject that touches us all by the bestselling author of *Of Claire of the Sea Light* Edwidge Danticat's *The Art of Death* writing the final story is at once a personal account of her mother dying from cancer and a deeply considered reckoning with the ways that other writers have approached death in their own work writing has been the primary way i have tried to make sense of my losses danticat notes in her introduction i have been writing about death for as long as i have been writing the book moves outward from the shock of her mother's diagnosis and sifts through danticat's writing life and personal history all the while shifting fluidly from examples that range from gabriel garcía márquez's *One Hundred Years of Solitude* to toni morrison's *Sula* the narrative which continually circles the many incarnations of death from individual to large scale catastrophes culminates in a beautiful heartrending prayer in the voice of danticat's mother a moving tribute and a work of astute criticism the art of death is a book that will profoundly alter all who encounter it

there is one thing we can be sure of we are all going to die but once we accept that fact the questions begin in this thought provoking book philosophy professor shelly kagan examines the myriad questions that arise when we confront the meaning of mortality do we have reason to believe in the existence of immortal souls should we accept an account according to which people are just material objects nothing more can we make sense of the idea of surviving the death of one's body if i won't exist after i die can death truly be bad for me would immortality be desirable is fear of death appropriate is suicide ever justified how should i live in the face of death written in an informal and conversational style this stimulating and provocative book challenges many widely held views about death as it invites the reader to take a fresh look at one of the central features of the human condition the fact that we will die

in death and the afterlife philosopher samuel scheffler poses this thought experiment in order to show that the continued life of the human race after our deaths the afterlife of the title matters to us to an astonishing and previously neglected degree scheffler shows that in certain important respects the future existence of people who are as yet unborn matters more to us than our own continued existence and the continued existence of those we love without the expectation that humanity has a future many of the things that now matter to us would cease to do

so by contrast the prospect of our own deaths does little to undermine our confidence in the value of our activities despite the terror we may feel when contemplating our deaths the prospect of humanity's imminent extinction would pose a far greater threat to our ability to lead lives of wholehearted engagement scheffler demonstrates that although we are not unreasonable to fear death personal immortality like the imminent extinction of humanity would also undermine our confidence in the values we hold dear his arresting conclusion is that in order for us to lead value laden lives what is necessary is that we ourselves should die and that others should live amazon com

he was the only one he was the only man to have committed suicide in the town's seventeenth century history so begins donna merwick's fascinating tale of a dutch notary who ended his life in his adopted community of albany in a major feat of historical reconstruction she introduces us to adriaen janse van ilpendam and the long forgotten world he inhabited in holland's north american colony her powerful narrative will make readers care for this quiet and studious man an ordinary settler for whom the clash of empires brought tragedy like so many of his fellow countrymen janse left his dutch homeland as a young adult to try his luck in new netherland after spending a few years on manhattan island he moved on to the fur trading settlement today known as albany merwick traces his journey to a new continent and re-creates the satisfying existence this respected burgher enjoyed with his wife in the bustling town as a notary janse was in the author's words surrounded by stories those he listened to and recorded the hundreds he archived in a chest or trunk his familiar life was turned upside down by the british conquest of the colony merwick recounts the changes brought about by the new rulers and imagines the despair janse must have felt when english a language he had never learned replaced his native tongue in official transactions in any military adventure truth is alleged to be the first casualty merwick offers a poignant reminder that the first casualties are in fact people as much a musing on what history obscures as what it reveals her book is a superior work by a master practitioner of her craft

archbishop alban goodier's j fills in the many blanks in the historical narratives about the passion of jesus christ with a riveting account based on history culture and his own deep spiritual insights he brings to life and unifies the many observations emotions and subtle and not so subtle actions that revolve around the person of god the son as he faces his most tragic and triumphant moment the author's unique approach intersperses scripture accounts with the commentary of an incisive narrator who sifts and judges from the span of hundreds of years he draws from the

the death of death in the death of christ is john owen s definitive work on the extent of the atonement it is a polemical work designed to show among other things that the doctrine of universal redemption is unscriptural and destructive of the gospel it was called forth by the progress in england of arminianism and the half way house of amyraldianism adopted by baxter davenant and usher

a meticulous and shattering investigation of eight horrific pictures l arche in december 1941 on a shore near the latvian city of liepaja nazi death squads the einsatzgruppen and local collaborators murdered in three days more than 2 700 jews the majority were women and children most men having already been shot during the summer the perpetrators took pictures of the december killings these pictures are among the rare photographs from the first period of the extermination during which over 800 000 jews from the baltic to the black sea were shot to death by showing the importance of photography in understanding persecution nadine fresco offers a powerful meditation on these images while confronting the essential questions of testimony and guilt from the forward by dorota glowackay straddling the boundary between historical inquiry and personal reflection this extraordinary text unfolds as a series of encounters with eponymic holocaust photographs although only a small number of photographs are reproduced here fresco provides evocative descriptions of many well known images synagogues and torah scrolls burning on the night of kristallnacht deportations to the ghettos and the camps and finally mass executions in the killing fi elds of eastern europe the unique set of photographs included in on the death of jews shows groups of women and children from liepaja liepāja shortly before they were killed in december 1941 in the dunes of shkede Škéde on the baltic sea in the last photograph of the series we see the victims bodies tumbling into the pit

principle into practice physician assisted suicide illustrates the application of generally valid rules a model that provides predictability and simplicity and more importantly avoids the personal biases that influence case by case judgments the author then takes up the debate over forcing pregnant women to accept treatments to save their fetuses he uses this issue to weigh the avoidance of perverse incentives an approach to translation that follows principles hesitantly for fear of generating unintended results and third orentlicher considers the denial of life sustaining treatment on grounds of medical futility in his evaluation of the tragic choices model which hides difficult life and death choices in order to prevent paralyzing social conflict
